ORDINANCE 06-10

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE PARKER ROAD COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 190, FLORIDA STATUTES (2005); NAMING THE DISTRICT; DESCRIBING THE EXTERNAL BOUNDARIES OF THE DISTRICT; DESCRIBING THE FUNCTIONS AND POWERS OF THE DISTRICT; DESIGNATING FIVE PERSONS TO SERVE AS THE INITIAL MEMBERS OF THE DISTRICT'S BOARD OF SUPERVISORS; ADDRESSING ORDINANCE CONFLICTS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Oakmont at Gainesville, LLP ("Petitioner"), having obtained written consent to the establishment of the District by the owner of 100 percent of the real property to be included in the District, petitioned the Alachua County Board of Commissioners (the "County") to adopt an ordinance establishing the Parker Road Community Development District (the "District") pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes (2005); and

WHEREAS, the Petitioner is a Florida Limited Liability Partnership, authorized to conduct business in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, all interested persons and affected units of general-purpose local government were afforded an opportunity to present oral and written comments on the Petition at a duly noticed public hearing conducted by the County on May 23, 2006; and

WHEREAS, upon consideration of the record established at that hearing, the County determined that the statements within the Petition were true and correct, that the establishment of the District is not inconsistent with any applicable element or portion of the state comprehensive plan or the local government comprehensive plan, that the land within the District is of sufficient size, is sufficiently compact, and sufficiently contiguous to be developable as a functionally interrelated community, that the District is the best alternative available for delivering community development services and facilities to the area served by the District, that the services and facilities of the District will not be incompatible with the capacity and uses of existing local and regional community development services and facilities, and that the area to be served by the District is amenable to separate special-district governance; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of the District will constitute a timely, efficient, effective, responsive and economic way to deliver community development services in the area described in the Petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Findings. The above recitals are adopted as findings of fact in support of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Authority. This ordinance is adopted in compliance with and pursuant to the Uniform Community Development District Act of 1980, Chapter 190, Florida Statutes (2005).

Section 3. Chapter 37.2, Title 3, Alachua County Code, is hereby amended as follows:

**CHAPTER 37.2
PARKER ROAD COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT**

Sec. 37.2.1. District Name.

There is hereby established a Community Development District situated entirely within Alachua County, Florida, which District shall be known as the "Parker Road Community Development District."

Sec. 37.2.2. External Boundaries of the District.

The external boundaries of the District are described in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated by reference, the overall parcel containing 556 acres, more or less.

Sec. 37.2.3. Functions and Powers.

The general powers and functions of the District are described in Chapter 190, Florida Statutes. The District is also authorized to exercise additional powers to finance, fund, plan, establish, acquire, construct, reconstruct, enlarge or extend, equip, operate and maintain systems and facilities for parks and facilities for indoor and outdoor recreation, cultural and educational uses, all as authorized as described in Section 190.012(2)(a), Florida Statutes (2005).

Sec. 37.2.4. Board of Supervisors.

The five persons designated to serve as initial members of the District's Board of Supervisors are as follows: Andrew J. Hagan, Esq., Cynthia C. Jones, Erum Siddiqui, Esq., Kelly Kulinski, and Ken LaPointe. All of the above-named persons are residents of the State of Florida and citizens of the United States.

Section 4. Conflict. The terms of this Ordinance shall govern to the extent of any conflict with any other County ordinance.

Section 5. Severability. All provisions of this Ordinance are severable and should a court of competent jurisdiction determine finally any provision hereof to be in conflict with law such that the offending provision and other law cannot coexist, such provision shall be deemed stricken and the remainder shall survive in full force and effect to the extent legally possible.

Section 6. Effective Date. A certified copy of this ordinance shall be filed with the Department of State by the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners within ten (10) days after enactment by Board of County Commissioners, and shall take effect upon filing with the Department of State.
